With limited funding and lack of events, NJSA finances was impacted. However, the association managed to honour all fixed expenses and an unqualified audit finding was presented for 2020 and is attached with the Chairman's report.

The committee generously made a COVID-19 Coaches Fund available to assist those NJSA Coaches dependent on the game of squash for a living. 4 individuals were ably assisted with a R15,000 grant each during the trying times of Shutdown Level 5 & 4.

The 2020 results yielded an operating loss of just under R41 000. Investment interest softened the loss to under R12 000.

Due to the pandemic and curtailing of the season the committee has decided to not charge a Registration fee for any paid up 2020 junior.

ADMINISTRATION

The success of a joint administrator continued during 2020. Gerda Dryer continuously gives up more than required serving the three associations.
