JUNIOR IPT'S

The IPT, albeit a different approach, showed NJSA's strength with a split event. Port Elizabeth hosted the Coastal chapter, whilst NJSA participated in the Northern Chapter hosted by Joburg Squash, Johannesburg

SA SCHOOLS CONVENTION

The convention was held in Cape Town in August and was well attended by all provinces. After 3 decades of service Grant Norton stepped down as SA School President with Margo Morgan stepping into the role.

It is also with great pleasure to note that Gerda Dreyer was voted onto the SA Schools Executive Committee.

NJSA AWARDS FUNCTION

An intimate affair due to crowd restrictions and COVID-19 protocols, a successful event was held recognising the individual awards for outstanding performance.

FINANCES

Albeit an increase in activity we did experience a reduction in player entries and as such the average revenue from events was not as per the norms of 2018 and 2019.

NJSA finances were impacted, however, the association managed to honour all fixed expenses and a clean audit finding was presented for 2021.

There was also an investment made with the creation of streaming kits to allow spectators to witness matches off-site. 16 kits have been created for future use.

A net operating loss of R32 000 was recorded for the financial year but it must be noted that no registration fee was charged for any 2020 active juniors: usually recognising more than R40 000 per annum.

LEADERSHIP TEAM

The NJSA Committee, a team that didn't waiver in their support, voiced their opinion when required and kept me in check with many words of wisdom.

The team ran what is now regarded as the best run junior tournaments in the country but most importantly, put junior squash first.

I owe my gratitude to you for an amazing junior province.

To our administrator, Gerda Dreyer, without you we would simply not be. Always a smile on her face, and the will to do her best, not only NJSA and all associations are most certainly better off today.

We bid farewell to two members who have decided to move on and make way for new members to experience the exhilaration of NJSA. Chris and Jana Lessing came on board in a dire situation to organise an IPT within 3 weeks, leaving 6 years later with NJSA in a healthy situation. Thank you.

We welcome the new committee for 2022, duly elected at the AGM Brett Cousins (Chairperson), Donald Weir (Vice-Chairperson), Saartjie Cromhout (Treasurer), Gerda Dreyer (Administrator) and Christo Oliver, Etienne Badenhorst, Hennie van Eck, Ian Craig, Kelsey Cousins, Reinhardt Falk, Tracy Randall (All general members)

Another tough year awaits with a high standard being set but we are in good hands.
